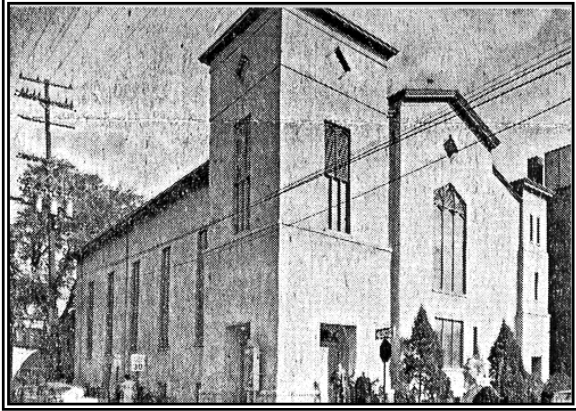

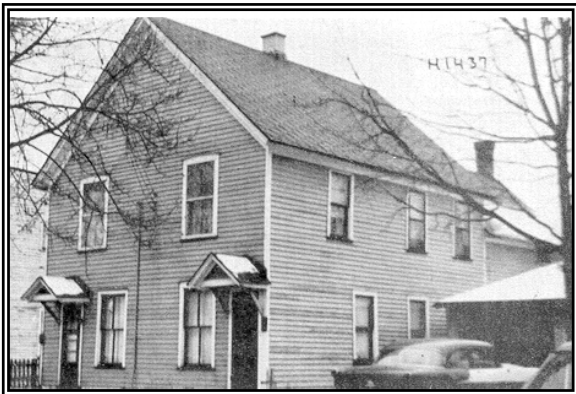

625 First N.W. Strom Construction Co. This firm suffered a fire which completely destroyed a large frame shed on its property at 3:08 a.m. on Saturday, August 7, 1954,

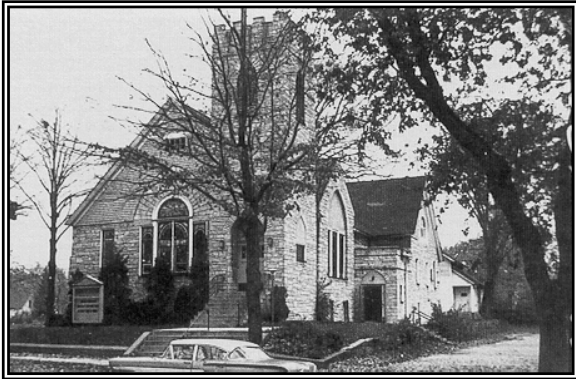
