**625 Second N.W.** This large 2-story frame flat had been the home of the Oscar Martin family in the 1930's and 1940's. It was listed for sale by



the owner, Mrs. S. Swiencicki, in 1961 for \$8,000, although the assessed valuation was only \$3,000. The house stood on a 52' x 57' lot on the northeast corner of Lexington Avenue. Both the downstairs and upstairs apartments had 5 rooms and a bath. There was a gas conversion furnace for the lower apartment and a
