1754 Alpine N.W. Crystal Flash. John Fehsenfeld started the business in 1930 with \$15,000 in borrowed capital, a rented office, and one truck. Throughout the years it has remained a family business, with Thomas Fehsenfeld, grandson of the founder, now serving as president. Crystal Flash in 1998 had approximately \$15 million in annual sales, 32 gas stations, and roughly 60 trucks on the road distributing propane, commercial fuels, and home heating fuels.

2150 Alpine N.W. This landmark factory building was constructed in 1942 by the Haskelite Corporation of 701 Ann N.W. to build wooden gliders for use in World War II. In the early 1950's, General Motors bought the factory and built fuselages for F-84 Thunder Streak fighter planes. In 1995, GM's Delphi Automotive Systems took over the plant. GM sold the plant to the Lear Corporation in 1998. The plant ended production on November 11, 2005, and on December 22 the keys were turned over to new owners.
