

332 Barclay N.E. Engine House No. 2. Although the date on the face of the building was 1879, the city directory for 1875 already gives this location on Barclay just south of Michigan (E. Bridge Street) for this fire station. The



old No. 2 on Bond (Kent Street) north of Crescent (Bronson Street) became part of the new Engine House No. 4. The fire extinguisher Advance was stationed here. It may be that the building was not completed and ready for occupancy by a fire company until 1879. Due to its deteriorating condition, it was decommissioned fire station as а September 21. 1966. The engine company was relocated to Fire Station No. at Kalamazoo S.E. to better serve the expanding south end of the city. The building was used for

some years for storage by the Grand Rapids Coat and Apron Co., to the north across the alley. The south stall still had the set of old rails on which the steamer had been backed in for an exact connection to the boiler. (Old number: 220.
