1545 Breton S.E. (EGR). Robert and Julie Connors are the 1994 owners of this 1880-1894 farmhouse. A 3-story addition designed in 1993 by architect Markku R. Allison of Bolt Associates created open areas inside for more contemporary living, while the exterior character was retained. The house won the 1994 Distinguished Building Award from the Grand Valley Chapter of the A.I.A.
