2420 Coit N.E. Riverside Elementary School. Opened Thursday, March 11, 1954, with 450 students from the old Fairmount School on Oakwood Avenue marching on foot to their new quarters. Riverside 6th Grade Academy (Riverside North), renovated in 1956. Capacity: 363. 2009-10 enrollment: 189. Closed in 2010, the school was sold in October, 2011, for \$510,000 to Gerry A. Haan Development of Harbor Springs, with a view to turning it into a 50-unit senior housing complex.
