44 Coldbrook N.W. Autodie International, Inc., the firm occupying this 438,000-square-foot factory, had its origin in December, 1992, when Progressive Tool & Industries formed a subsidiary to pay \$33.8 million for most of the bankrupt Autodie Corp., a public company founded in 1962 by Joseph Spruit. The company produced mostly large dies and molds sold to auto manufacturers to make parts such as hoods, fenders, and body sides. As recently as 1998, the firm employed 860 people, and was one of the largest independent tool and die shops in the state.
