The project was to be undertaken by Dwelling Place Inc. and Gough Properties, an Indiana developer. The 195,000-square-foot building was occupied at the time by 17 different businesses. The original building at the southwest corner of Commerce and Goodrich was built in 1904. It received major additions in 1910 and 1921. The original owner of the building was the Globe Knitting Works, an underwear manufacturing company whose name still appears in stone above one of its portals. Globe was one of Grand Rapids' largest employers, with more than 1,800 workers. In 1955, the factory was closed by Globe's parent company, Aetna Industrial Corp. It remained empty until 1963, when the Monical Machinery Co. bought it. Owners Tim and Dorothy Holt renamed the company Monitor Machinery in 1985.
