Unable to participate fully in sociocultural programs open to Americans because of language limitations, Polish settlers in Grand Rapids organized the Polish National Hall on Jackson Street in 1889. It was the first Polish hall in the United States. In 1912, it was called the National Polish Aid Society Hall. By 1948, the Valley City Post No. 356 of the American Legion was also headquartered here. (Old # 181.)
