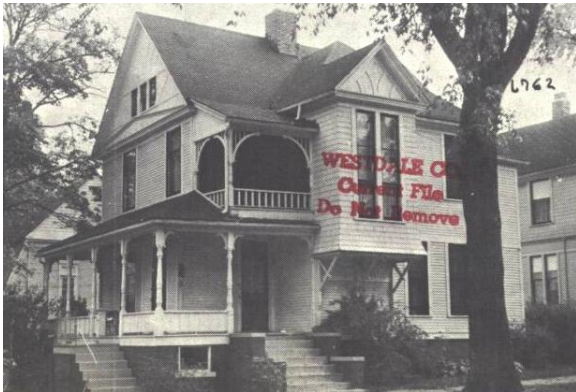

427 James S.E. The Grand Rapids Women's Study Club was established in 1901 by eight African American women to educate themselves and keep up with the news of the wider world. Eventually they purchased this 2-story home to serve as their clubhouse, which it did until it fell into disrepair and was sold in 2002. Over the years, noted literary figures visited here for programs which were first opened to the general public in 1945. Langston Hughes (1954) and Louis Lomax (1960) were among the famous personages whom the study club sponsored. The renamed Study Class in 2004 meets at the Browning Claytor Health Center community room at 1246 Madison S.E. (Cf.
