

Market Avenue Bridge. Opened to traffic on Friday, August 19, 1994, the new \$3.2 million bridge over Plaster Creek was specially designed to carry additional sewer lines to the wastewater treatment plant. The road had been closed since January to permit construction of the new bridge, through which passes all of the 65 million gallons of the city's sewage each day. The bridge replaced a 1928 structure.
