

### **Sweet Street, N.W.**

Martin L. Sweet was a colorful character and the first Republican mayor of Grand Rapids, having first come to the city in the mid-1840's. Sweet established himself not only as mayor, but as miller, farmer, and owner of Sweet's Hotel, later the Pantlind and the Amway Grand Plaza. He dabbled in a variety of businesses, and was reputed to have the first Holstein-Friesian cattle ever to come to Michigan. He bred the livestock on a farm which is now part of the Kent Country Club. Sweet died in 1905.
