



615 Turner N.W. Union School was built of river limestone in 1849. The third floor was used as an armory. The building was razed in 1872 and replaced by a new Union High





School. This building was in turn replaced by a more modern structure, the first half built along Fourth Street in 1909, the second half to the south completed a few years later. A plaque inside the Fourth Street entrance of the school reads: "This building erected A.D. 1909 by the Board of



Education. Robinson & Campau architects. C. Hoertz & Son contractors." The completed building had 250,000 square feet of space. Charles Everest served as principal here from 1922 to 1953, and Helen Olson was the school secretary for many years. Boys and girls had separate gymnasiums. The last Union class graduated from this building in 1968, when the school moved to its current building at 1800 Tremont N.W. Since then, this building served as West Middle School and then as Stockbridge Academy. In 2005, work began to transform the massive building into the Union Square condominiums, with the addition of a fifth story. 1044 Turner N.W. Turner Street School (Union School District No. 6) was built on this site in 1865. It was sold to the Netherlands Reformed Church in 1887. They dedicated it on February 5, 1888, and used it as a church for 20 years. As a church, it had a seating capacity of 600. It was bounded by a white picket fence, and had a pump in the front yard.

1044 Turner N.W. Turner Avenue (Ebenezer) Netherlands Reformed Church. The old church was torn down in 1908 and replaced by a red brick church of Daverman design.
